What is SAT?

SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) is a standardized examination where passing it is prerequisite for admittance to many colleges and universities in the USA. It is the nation’s most widely used college admission test and the 1st step towards tertiary education for students of all backgrounds. **SAT** is taken by over 2M students annually and is accepted by virtually all US colleges and universities.

SAT literally tests students on two major subjects---English and Maths, skills that students will have already learnt in high school that are crucial to the success in college education and throughout one’s life.

SAT English consists of two parts: reading and writing, which further breaks down into sentence completion; reading comprehension; multiple choice, critical reading and proofreading. It is a fair and straightforward assessment; a stepping stone to connect to scholarship opportunities and a means to realise one’s academic strengths.

To secure a firm grasp of vocabulary and be able to use them correctly, it’s the core of SAT success.
