

English All The Way (EATW) is an English workshop founded in Nov 2001 by Carol Choi, offering creative, comprehensive, effectual and guided English classes for students from K2 to secondary in a clean, bright and comfortable environment in the hub of Causeway Bay. Throughout the years, EATW has expanded from a student base of a mere 22 to over 90 to date, now boasting a local school profile of MPS; MSS; DGS; DBS; DPS; MCS, Wah Yan HK and Kln; St. Paul's Convent; St.Paul's Secondary; Sacred Heart; St.Joseph; La Salle; St.Paul's Co-ed; Raimondi; Ying Wah Girls; St.Stephen's (Stanley); St.Stephen's Girls; True Light; Heep Yun; Canossa;, Lingnan; Victoria; St. Louis; St.Mary's; St. Clare's; St Paul's Boys... etc, while the number of students from international schools e.g. GSIS; HKIS; CIS; CDNIS and ESFs has also surged considerably. Private one-on-one classes for both students and adults are available on request.

All classes conducted by Ms. Carol Choi, recipient of Advanced (1st Class) Diploma in English as a Foreign Language (ESOL)-Pitman Jul'03; Advanced (1st Class) Certificate in Spoken ESOL – Pitman Mar '03; Advanced Certificate in ESOL – Pitman Mar '03; University Of Cambridge Certificate Of Proficiency In English (June '02), MSS graduate (Maryknoll Sisters' School P.1–F. 6), MPS in-house trainer for Hong Kong Speech Festival since '99, MPS-ECA "Fun With English" P.6 volunteer teacher ('01-'02), MPS-PTA web editorial board ('00-'02), British Council "ICTE-A" Introductory course in teaching English to Adults ('95), Upper Chine School, Isle of Wight, UK ('80-'81). For 3 consecutive years ('99-'01), with the full consent and support of the MPS Principal and English teachers during the intensive Speech Festival rehearsals, MPS girls walked off with flying colours. In the 53<sup>rd</sup> Annual Speech Festival, MPS girls (P.2-6) fared exceptionally well and excelled brilliantly, achieving outstanding results producing seven winners, eleven 1st runner-ups and ten 2<sup>nd</sup> runner-ups.

In order to cope with surging demand for class expansions, Auntie Liza has been the summer school tutor since 2004, who has also added K2+3; all FPs; L1 and L2 under her wings since 2006. Whoever the tutor is, parents are ensured that everything taught in EATW follows a stringent set of teaching materials, well received by parents and students as they are proven effective and comprehensive.

## A Multi-faceted Approach

- 7 students per class and strictly adheres to "no Chinese during lesson"
- Phonics, intonation, diction and elocution are taught through interactive activities & word games (e.g. board games, word search, puzzles, bingo, dominoes, crosswords, picture / flash cards, hangman...etc), hence students are able to gradually grasp the vital fundamentals necessary for good oral & written English
- Grammar drill, sentence structure, vocabulary, essay writing, sentence making, reading comprehension, quizzes and impromptu dictations included in all classes
- Topics covered in EATW classes supplementing school syllabus and relevant mock papers to drill all students during school tests / exams periods
- Older students (P.4+) engaged in more writing while all classes are supplemented with weekly worksheets
- Upper primary (P.4-6) and secondary students encouraged to prepare their own speeches on a variety of topics for discussions & presentations in class
- All students keep a vocabulary book and encouraged to speak up, thus be able to engage in small talk as well as converse effectively in English under different scenarios
- Common English errors; synonyms; antonyms; homophones; homonyms; homographs; compound words; phrasal verbs; metaphors; similes; idioms; proverbs, and all crucial parts / figures of speech covered
- Students assimilating proper English through a variety of activities: songs, poems and rhymes, read n' draw, story-telling/story reading, conversations and VCDs...etc, ensuing spontaneous, enjoyable and inspirational classes
- Streamed "Foundation Phonics 1,2,3" Classes for students to learn , digest and progress comfortably and confidently at their own pace
- "Drama & Poetry" class debuted in Sep 04 for P.4+ students, hosting delightful and entertaining annual performances for parents and friends. That further led onto the debut of "Diction & Reading-DR" in 2009 to drill students in lively oral English conversations with emphasis placed on proper diction and intonation.
- "Grammar & Writing" GW5 class made its debut in Sep 06 for P.5-6 students to drill them in all manners of parts of speech / creative writing & enhance their vocabulary. Now expanded to GW6 and GW7 for P6 and F1 students.
- SAT Classes made their debut in Jan 2011 catered for senior students in preparation for college entrance in the USA
- Good manners & social etiquette discussed while interesting topics; tall stories plus world news extracted from the SCMP; the Standard; BBC and The London Evening News shared
- "Tips For Parents" specially selected by Auntie Carol handed out regularly
